#### BOARD MEETING MINUTES 5 DECEMBER 2006

#### I. Call to Order

Chairman David Parker convened the meeting of The Florida International University Board of Trustees at 9:10 a.m., on Tuesday, 5 December 2006, at University Park Campus, College of Law Main Courtroom, Miami, Florida.

#### II. Chairman's Remarks:

Chairman Parker welcomed all Trustees, University faculty and staff. He also recognized FIU Foundation Directors David Perlman and Ted Spak. He thanked the University's College of Law staff for its hard work in making the meeting possible.

Chairman Parker introduced newly-appointed Dean of the University's College of Medicine Dr. John A. Rock, noting that on November 14<sup>th</sup> Dr. Rock was appointed as founding Dean of the FIU College of Medicine and executive Vice President for Medical affairs.

Chairman Parker congratulated Rick Mello who was recently appointed Associate Vice President and Executive Director of the FIU Athletics Finance Corporation, noting that subsequently, the Sun Belt Conference had asked Rick to serve as its Associate Commissioner. Chairman Parker introduced recently appointed Athletic Director, Pete Garcia, noting that Garcia was a former executive with the Cleveland Browns where he served as Vice President of Player personnel and Football development.

On behalf of the Board, Chairman Parker, thanked Dr. Wertheim as well as the Wertheim family for their service and all they have done for the University and for the community over the last two decades.

#### III. FIU Foundation Report

Foundation Chairman Larry Kahn reported on fundraising and provided an update on Foundation investments as of October 31, 2006. He also reported that Alumni membership reached a new high in 2006.

#### IV. Requests to Address the Board:

There were no requests to address the Board

#### V. University Report

President Maidique reported that the American Bar Association (ABA) granted the University's College of Law full accreditation on Friday, 1 December 2006. He added that the panel accredited the program less than five years after the University's College of Law opened its doors in 2002.

President Maidique reported that as of November 21, 2006, the University has certified more than \$521,000 for the First Generation Scholarship Matching Program, noting that the funds were eligible for state match for a total scholarship pool of more than \$1 Million to fund students by providing these important scholarships.

President Maidique reported on the Executive MBA program in the University's College of Business Administration and on the World Class Scholars and Centers of Excellence Programs established by the Legislature. He also reported that the October issue of *Living Real Miami* placed FIU among the 25 best places to work in Miami and that five-time Grammy Award winning singer, songwriter, producer, actor, philanthropist, New York Times bestselling author and Miami icon, Gloria Estefan was named FIU's Wisdom Scholar in Residence for the 2006/07 academic year

President Maidique noted that on December 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, the University would be hosting five Commencement ceremonies when more than 3200 students will become FIU alumni. He invited all to attend any or all of these ceremonies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the policy attached hereto as Exhibit "H" shall be effective immediately solely for all non-bargaining unit personnel;

### Miami's public research university Priorities for the 2007 Legislative Session

March 6 - May 4, 2007

Each of Florida International University's priorities has been approved by the Board of Governors in their Legislative Budget Request for the State University System.

#### **OPERATING BUDGET PRIORITIES**

#### I. ENROLLMENT GROWTH

FIU asks the Legislature to support the Board of Governors (BOG) request to fund an additional 10,061 FTEs. This requires \$148.3 million (\$106.2 General Revenue and \$42.1 million Student Fees) in funding. Of that, \$31.7 million (\$21.9 new General Revenue) will be allocated to FIU for 1899 FTEs. The funding of enrollment is required to maintain access to the state universities especially in light of continued success in raising the high school graduation rate around the state.

#### II. FIU MEDICAL SCHOOL

On March 23, 2006, the Board of Governors approved the implementation of a new medical school at FIU. The Legislature followed suit during the 2006 Session by authorizing the Board approved College of Medicine at FIU with the passage of HB 1237. Within the BOG's SUS Medical Education Initiative for 2007-2008, \$5.47 million is requested specifically to plan for the implementation of the FIU Medical School. FIU urges the Legislature to continue its support.

#### III. FACULTY AND STAFF SALARIES

FIU competes nationally to attract quality faculty to our campus. We also must face regional competition in retaining qualified staff. Faculty and staff salaries continue to be one of the highest priorities for the BOG. The BOG and the state's universities have pledged to work together with the Florida Legislature to provide the funds that will allow FIU and the other state universities to compensate their faculty and staff on a competitive basis. FIU urges the Legislature to pursue policies and funding that will ensure FIU's faculty and staff are compensated appropriately.

### IV. ENHANCEMENT FUNDS TO SUPPORT THE BOG STRATEGIC PLAN

The BOG budget requests \$185.6 million in enhancement funds for university initiatives to support the system's strategic plan. FIU's portion of the BOG request is \$16.7 million. Each of FIU's proposals is important to the academic climate of the school and the community well being. The priorities within FIU's request are:

- 1. Continuing the legislative support for Life Sciences at \$4 million
- 2. Improved access to core courses (Math and Science Faculty) at \$1 million
- 3. Automated student degree tracking and communication system to enhance graduation and retention at \$2.9 million
- 4. Hurricane risk assessment and construction research program enhancements Wall of Wind Project at \$2.9 million
- 5. Minority Biotech Institute expanding the research capabilities at \$2 million
- 6. Enhancing Teacher Retention and Administrative Interaction: Urban Educational Leadership/Principal's Academy at \$1.5 million
- 7. Improve student access to wireless information technology and media-enabled classrooms at \$1.7 million (this issue is tied to the BOG proposal for a technology fee)
- 8. Florida Entrepreneurial Climate Study which will assess state and regional economic dynamics at \$.7 million

#### V. RATIO OF IN-STATE/OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS

As out-of-state tuition has risen more students are attending their own state's schools. For 2005-2006 an out-of-state undergraduate paid approximately 6 times more than a resident undergraduate, whereas an out-of-state graduate student paid approximately 5 times more than a resident graduate student. Thus as the number of out-of-state credit hours have declined the loss of out-of-state tuition revenue has been significant. The Legislature recognized this loss of tuition revenue and supported this issue in the 2006-2007 appropriations bill. FIU asks the Legislature for its continued support by funding the BOG system request at \$16.4 million. FIU will receive \$2.8 million from this issue to assist in offsetting our loss of tuition revenue.

#### FIXED CAPITAL OUTLAY PRIORITIES

#### FIXED CAPITAL OUTLAY PROJECTS

The Board of Governors has requested \$318.2 million from the Public Education Capital Outlay Trust Fund for university projects. Of that, \$41.7 million is allocated to FIU for the following projects: \$7 million for Utilities/Infrastructure/Capital Renewal/Roofs, \$23 million for the Science/Classroom Complex, \$4.68 million for the Graduate Classroom Building and \$7.1 million for Chiller Plant.




### Mission/Purpose

The Office of Governmental Relations works to promote the interests of the University by serving as the principal liaison between the University and federal, state and local governments. Governmental Relations develops and disseminates critical information about the University to internal and external audiences to advocate the University's priorities in undergraduate and graduate instruction and applied and basic research. The Office also focuses external attention to the University's areas of emphasis which include: health/medicine, international affairs, hurricanes, environmental issues, and student life/ affinity.

Both the State and Federal Relations Offices work aggressively to advance FIU's mission as a top urban public research university by developing and implementing strategies for increasing funds and advancing the University's best interests. By working closely with faculty, university leaders, the Board of Trustees, and the Student Government Association, the Governmental Relations Office maximizes funding and shapes policies for the University and enhances its nationwide reputation and stature. Increasingly, Governmental Relations is also seeking to enhance local support for the University's expansion and development.
