1. Call to Order and Chair's Remarks

The Florida International University Board of Trustees' External Relations Committee meeting was called to order by Committee Chair Claudia Puig at 8:44 am on Wednesday, January 14, 2015 at the Modesto A. Maidique Campus, Graham Center Ballrooms.

Trustee Alexis Calatayud and University President Mark B. Rosenberg were also in attendance.

Committee Chair Puig welcomed all Trustees, faculty and staff to the meeting. She reminded the Committee of the upcoming FIU Day in Tallahassee, which she noted would take place on March 25, 2015. She stressed the importance of maintaining continued dialogue with local legislators who advocate for the University.

Committee Chair Puig noted that the FIU community joined Steve Sauls in December to celebrate his retirement and remarkable career, noting his many accomplishments and unwavering dedication during his 25 year tenure at the University. She welcomed Michelle Palacio to her first meeting as Vice President of Governmental Relations. Committee Chair Puig noted that Michelle is an FIU graduate and has been with FIU for 10 years.

2. Approval of Minutes

Committee Chair Puig asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the June 3, 2014 External Relations Committee meeting. Hearing none, a motion was made and passed to approve the Minutes of the External Relations Committee Meeting held on Tuesday, June 3, 2014.

3. President's Remarks

University President Mark B. Rosenberg congratulated Committee Chair Puig and Univision Radio Miami on the success of the 45th annual Three Kings Day Parade, noting that FIU was proud to take part in the annual community tradition that wraps up the holiday season. He reported that 2015 marks the 50th anniversary of FIU's founding, adding that in celebration of this milestone, the University is challenging FIU students, employees and alumni to "GIVE 50" – 50 hours of service to the community. He stated that this year's Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK) Day of Service kicks off the FIU Give 50 Challenge at MLK Park, further noting that the 2015 MLK Day Parade will salute the 50th anniversary of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

President Rosenberg added that FIU remains dedicated to the social and economic welfare of its community, reporting that the University is paying close attention to national and critical issues. He noted that on December 17, 2014 the President of the United States Barack Obama announced that the United States would be initiating steps towards changing its diplomatic and economic relationship with Cuba. President Rosenberg stated that as the U.S. reforms policy with Cuba, the Board's External Relations Committee will play a critical role in providing guidance on how the University can participate in a free and democratic Cuba. He added that the University's Cuban Research Institute (CRI) continues its tradition of convening scholars, students, and other persons interested in the study of Cuba and Cuban Americans by announcing its Tenth Conference. He indicated that this year's meeting will be dedicated to Dr. Carmelo Mesa-Lago in recognition of his multiple contributions to Cuban studies over more than five decades.

President Rosenberg stated that in order to explore the recent Sony issues related to cybersecurity, the University is convening thought leaders from government, business, nonprofits, academia and law for a half-day conference to discuss the facts and prospects going forward. He indicated that as developments regarding Sony, Korea and Paris continue to unfold, security watchers are reporting surges in the spread of ransomware, a type of malware which restricts access to the computer system it infects and demands a ransom paid to the creator of the malware in order for the restriction to be removed.

President Rosenberg noted that FIU students and faculty have discussed current legal issues of the day, such as that of police officer-involved shootings. Trustee Gerald C. Grant, Jr. recommended that the University consider the viability of offering sensitivity training programs to local police units. President Rosenberg responded that the University administration will follow-up as current issues continue to unfold.

4. Information/Discussion Items

4.1 2015 Legislative Priorities

Vice President of Governmental Relations Michelle Palacio provided an overview of the 2015 Legislative Priorities, noting that FIU asks for support of its advocacy efforts in seeking \$20 million in state funds for the relocation of the Fair and FIU's expansion. She added that recurring funding is requested for FIU programs that serve South Florida's unique populations, such as Panther LIFE, EMBRACE, Center for Children and Families and Fostering Panther Pride.

President Rosenberg noted that FIU continues to deepen its ties with the greater Miami by providing a solutions-center approach to significant problems in the community, adding that the University remains committed to excellence while promoting access and diversity for qualified students. He reported that from fall 2009 to present, dual enrollment courses, which enable high school students to earn college credit, have expanded from 425 to over 6,000 instances of enrollment, adding that the number of courses offered has increased from 16 to 127 and the number of participating schools has increased from six to 38. He stated that Bachelor's degrees awarded increased from 6,267 in 2009-10 to 8,068 in 2013-14.

4.2 Expansion Update

Senior Vice President of External Relations Sandra B. Gonzalez-Levy stated that Miami-Dade County voters approved a referendum that grants the University the county charter exemption needed to expand to the 64 acres next to the Modesto A. Maidique Campus. She added that FIU will continue to work with Miami-Dade County and Fair leaders to find a new, suitable location for the Fair, stating that the University remains committed to working with elected officials in Tallahassee to identify the funds to pay for the relocation. She indicated that costs and timing are important factors as sites are considered for a win-win-win solution. On behalf of the University, she thanked the Board of Trustees and FIU Foundation Board of Directors for their continued support of FIU's expansion efforts.

5. New Business

No new business was raised.

6. Concluding Remarks and Adjournment

With no other business, Committee Chair Claudia Puig adjourned the meeting of the Florida International University Board of Trustees External Relations Committee on Wednesday, January 14, 2015 at 9:30 am.

Talent Development Network

Since it was formally launched in April, the Talent Development Network (TDN) – a regional internship program that aligns academia with economic development needs – has reached some significant milestones. A press launch for the program was held April 15 and included representatives from six colleges and universities including FIU; the Miami-Dade County Public School District (M-DCPS); and the Beacon Council. The event generated significant media coverage and helped pave the way for additional support from employers interested in recruiting local talent. Already four students have been selected for internships through the TDN program – three with American Airlines and one with the Miami-Dade County Office of Budget and Management.

The online portal for students and employers has launched at <u>tdnmiami.com</u>, allowing employers to easily register, post internships and recruit talent from seven major academic institutions across Miami-Dade County. In addition, students from the six colleges and universities are able to access the portal using their institutions' login credentials.

Presentations on the program have been given to multiple chambers of commerce and the Career Services teams from each of the academic institutions have formed a Career Services Board to implement a preparedness verification process for students, to be sure top talent is selected for the program. In addition, industry meetings have been held in Information Technology, Banking and Finance and Hospitality and Tourism to further

align industry needs with academic offerings as the program progresses through its two-year pilot phase. The goal is to create 200 new paid internships in two years.

U.S. Hispanic Chamber of Commerce

FIU has signed a groundbreaking collaborative agreement with the U.S. Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (USHCC), the first such partnership between the USHCC and a public university in the nation. The agreement will promote both entities' shared interests including research, economic development and legislative advocacy on a local, state and national level. In addition, the USHCC will partner with FIU on increasing student internships, jobs and scholarships. Beyond creating career opportunities for FIU students, the USHCC will connect the University to Hispanic-owned businesses around the United States for possible collaboration. USHCC is the largest Hispanic business organization in the country, advocating on behalf of nearly 3.2 million Hispanic-owned businesses and serving as an umbrella organization for more than 200 local chambers and business organizations throughout the U.S.

In April, a delegation of seven FIU alumni and small business owners participated in the USHCC Legislative Summit in Washington, D.C. The summit was an opportunity for FIU alumni to network with key business and industry leaders from throughout the country, as well as government agencies and elected officials such as Congressman Carlos Curbelo, who attended the summit. FIU also participated in the USHCC's Presidential Candidate Q&A series, featuring Governor Martin O'Malley. USHCC President and CEO Javier Palomarez will speak at FIU's Fall Commencement ceremonies. USHCC and FIU also are pursuing joint communications efforts, including guest editorials in national publications.

Fostering Panther Pride

Fostering Panther Pride (FPP), FIU's innovative program to support the academic and personal success of former foster care and homeless youth, continues to make a difference in these students' lives. This spring, more than 80 former foster care and homeless students were enrolled at FIU. More than 50 of these were active participants in the FPP program, meeting with the Success Coach and participating in events and activities. More than 80 percent of FPP students were in good academic standing; 30 percent had a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Nine students from FPP graduated this spring, including two who were named Worlds Ahead Graduates – Kenya Adeola and Ruth Rios, who each overcame significant obstacles to achieve their academic goals. This summer FPP awarded 12 housing scholarships and 14 for the fall semester. Housing

scholarship amounts range from \$1,000 to \$3,000 and students are asked to submit essays documenting their need.

This spring, numerous activities and events were held for FPP students, including workshops on time management and study skills; resume writing and interviewing skills; financial literacy, including budgeting, loans and credit; how to complete the FAFSA financial aid form; and how to navigate the transition after college.

Finally, the FPP team has selected three research proposals to receive funding through the program, as part of the state allocation for FPP. One will focus on evaluating and improving the FPP mentor program; the second will investigate the barriers that prevent former foster youth from entering higher education; and the third will assess the academic success of students in their first and second years of the program to increase understanding of the obstacles these students face and to make recommendations for improvement.

2015 Legislative Special Session Report

This year, the Florida Legislature provided nearly \$33 million in new and restored funding for FIU. Governor Rick Scott signed the 2015-16 budget June 23rd.

Below are the \$24.5 million in FIU projects that were newly funded by the legislature and approved by the Governor:

- \$11 million net increase in Performance Funding
- \$2.3 million for the Satellite Chiller Plant Expansion at MMC
- \$2.7 million for Renovations, Remodeling and Repairs
- \$3.9 million recurring for FIUnique, which includes: \$1.5 million for the Center for Children and Families, \$1.5 million for the College of Medicine EMBRACE program, \$600,000 for the College of Education Panther LIFE program, and \$300,000 for the Fostering Panther Pride program.
- \$600,000 for the Washington Center for Internships and Academic Seminars of which half is recurring dollars
- \$300,000 in additional funding for the FIU Center for Democracy
- \$3.7 million for Hurricane Research and Mitigation Projects

In addition to these new funds, the legislature also restored proposed budget cuts to FIU:

- \$2.5 million for the College of Medicine's Neighborhood HELP program
- \$1 million for the College of Law's Center for Ethics and Professionalism
- \$500,000 for The FIU Center for Democracy
- \$250,000 for The FIU Center for Leadership
- \$331,451 for the College of Medicine Primary Care Residency Program

The following FIU items were funded by the Legislature but vetoed by the Governor, among the \$500 million in vetoed projects statewide:

- \$5 million for Strategic Land Acquisition (FIU Expansion)
- \$3 million for the FIU-Royal Caribbean BBC housing mold remediation
- \$500,000 for the West End Tech Center, an FIU partnership with Topp Solutions
- \$200,000 for the Applied Research Center

The FIU expansion project has a lot of momentum based on the overwhelming voter support we received in November. In addition, we have received \$10 million toward the relocation project, which was allocated by the Legislature and approved by the Governor last year.

Sales Tax Exemptions Impacting FIU

The Legislature passed HB33A and the bill was signed into law by the Governor. The bill includes nearly \$430 million in tax cuts and creates a sales tax exemption for textbooks and instructional materials for the entire 2015-16 fiscal year, beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016. The exemption applies to students who provide their Panther ID and syllabus as proof. The bill also creates the back to school sales tax holiday from August 7-August 16, 2015 in which various items sold on campus including clothing, school supplies and computers are tax exempt. Also included in the bill is a clarification of current law relating to college prepaid meal plans making the plans tax exempt when purchased before or after enrollment, with financial aid or directly from a third party vendor.
